Translating Standards into training programs (Room Sumatra)

Internationally accepted standards in Technical Vocational Education and Training play a crucial role to ensure quality in TVET delivery. Session IIA:

Enabling labour mobility- the case of standards in the tourism sector in ASEAN

(Room Sumatra)

The tourism sector plays a crucial role in many ASEAN member states for economic and social development. Based on the mutual recognition agreement (MRA) in the tourism sector ASEAN fosters the mobility of tourism professionals. However, implementation is still underway. The session discusses the architecture and capacities needed as well as focuses on particular challenges such as linking national occupational skills standards towards ASEAN Common Competency Standards for Tourism Professionals (ACCSTP) and the involvement of the tourism industry in development of competency standards.
